ENTRIES

Entries close on July 28 (by mail) / August 4 (online), <u>unless</u> <u>stall capacity is reached before August 4</u>. First come, first served basis.

In the case of a returned/bad check, a \$12 fee will be charged. Clearly indicate which is OPEN, 4-H/Ag-Ed. Entry forms must be signed by 4-H/Ag-Ed Exhibitors, Leaders and Parent or Guardian.

REFER TO GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS - Pg 2 First day's bedding furnished free of charge. After the first day, bedding will be the responsibility of exhibitor.

First entry list will be final. No added list or changes.

Livestock [except market swine] may be brought in Monday, Aug. 25, from Noon until 8PM and on Tuesday, Aug. 26, from 8AM until 5:30PM. Market steers, lambs, goats and dairy beef will be weighed-in on Tuesday between 3:30PM and 7:00PM. Market swine must arrive Thursday, Aug. 28, by 9AM and will be weighed-in at that time. All livestock [except market swine] MUST be in stables by 5PM on Tuesday, Aug. 26. All registration papers must be checked in by 6PM, Tuesday. Each exhibitor is entitled to one exhibitor's pass. NOTE: No entries will be accepted unless entry fees are paid at the time entries are made.

When completing entries, list breeds separately and keep classes in order. Have entries legible, precise and accurate, or they will be rejected.

NOTE: All livestock washing will be done between the wash rack pipes and Ag Hall.

NOTE: No muzzles allowed on grounds. No bull rings allowed in <u>Steer Show</u>. Buckets of water to be in sheep and goat pens at all times.

NOTE: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know the judging schedule. Stock must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competition.

NOTE: If a junior exhibitor has 2 animals in a class, the junior exhibitor must show one animal. Both exhibitor and leg setter must be juniors; second animal may be shown by another junior.

Barn fans will be limited to one fan every 25', hanging type. No fans will be permitted on the ground.

Livestock MUST be removed on Monday, September 2 before midnight.

The Society will NOT be responsible for any exhibits after 8PM Tuesday.

Any exhibitor not adhering to these rules for the removal of livestock will forfeit any premiums to which they would otherwise have been entitled, and be banned from future shows.

Each exhibitor must specify the number of animals and breed included in the entry. All breeding animals must have been registered in the exhibitor's name at least 30 days prior to show.

NOTE: All animals exhibited can automatically be used for contests; however, Allentown Fair Livestock Officials ask that all exhibitors be contacted for permission.

NOTE: Exhibitors will be allowed to leave Fairgrounds for other shows providing they: 1) receive prior permission, 2) they fulfill show requirements at Allentown, and 3) they switch animals to keep pens and stalls full. (Animals used to switch must follow same health rules and regulations.)

NOTE: The Fair reserves the right to accept or reject an entry or to remove from the grounds any objectionable exhibit or attendant without being liable for compensation.

NOTE: The Fair reserves the right to accept or reject entirely, partially or conditionally any entry or application. The management also reserves the right to personally, or to appoint a committee, to inspect all entries after they have arrived, and dismiss any entries that would discredit the Fair.

NOTE: False representation, interference, or discourteous conduct by any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Executive Committee according to the equities of the case or cause for dismissal.

NOTE: All exhibitors must have exhibitor numbers visible at all times when in show ring or no premiums will be awarded.

NOTE: The Fair and their Superintendents will make the final decision on whether animals in questionable health will remain on the grounds, without being liable for compensation.

NOTE: Exhibitors pens will be pre-assigned. All assignments will be final.

PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS

All premiums awarded in the Cattle, Swine, Goat and Sheep Departments will be paid in full by check at the Entry Office on Monday, Sept. 1. All errors on premium checks must be reported by Monday, Sept. 1, 2025.

The judge may, in all cases, require exhibitors to show animals (except bulls) outside of the stalls at the time of judging.

All animals must be registered in the recognized herd books of the respective breeds, and each exhibitor must furnish the certificate of registry or transfer of each animal to the Superintendent at the time of judging, or the herd book number of the same. All livestock to be judged according to standards adopted by the breed associations.

NOTE: Due to weight variances and weight limits the number of classes will be set by the Superintendent after weighin for all Market Classes for both Open and Youth Shows.

LIABILITY

The exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any accident to animals.

When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter and under control of owner or employee.

No bull over one year old will be allowed on the grounds without a ring in his nose.

THE USE OF DRUGS AND/OR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON THE FAIRGROUNDS IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED. ANYONE VIOLATING THIS PROVISION WILL BE EXPELLED FROM THE GROUNDS.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS & EXPOSITIONS NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics", fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.

2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.

3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.

4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedure performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or

livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of any penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

12. Please sign the entry form to indicate your support of this code of ethics. Each <u>exhibitor</u>, <u>parent and leader</u> is required to sign off on this code of ethics.

2025 PENNSYLVANIA FAIR ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS

Section 2: Cattle - General Information

I. Prohibition of exhibition of dairy cattle from influenzapositive, suspect, or high-risk farms:

1. Dairy cattle from a premises on which dairy animals are showing clinical signs of infection with influenza A virus are prohibited from entering an exhibition. Clinical signs may include a decrease in feed consumption, with a simultaneous decrease in rumination and rumen motility; respiratory signs including clear nasal discharge; and subsequent acute drop in milk production. Additional clinical signs may include abnormal tacky or loose feces, lethargy, dehydration, and fever. Severely affected cattle may have thicker, concentrated, colostrum-like milk or produce no milk at all. Animals showing clinical signs compatible with infection must be cleared by the State Animal Health Official.

2. Dairy cattle which have been on a premises where influenza A virus has been confirmed in dairy cattle are prohibited from entering an exhibition until that premises has been declared free of disease by the State Animal Health Official.

3. Dairy cattle which have been on a premises where influenza A virus has been confirmed in domestic birds are prohibited from entering an exhibition until that premises has been declared free of disease by the State Animal Health Official.

4. Dairy cattle which have been on a premises which is located within a three-kilometer area of a premises where influenza A virus has been confirmed in domestic birds are prohibited from entering an exhibition until the State Animal Health Official has declared that area as free of disease, based on epidemiological investigation and surveillance testing.

Pennsylvania Cattle

I. Requirements:

1. Pennsylvania cattle must have verification of a veterinaryclient-patient relationship (see Chapter A.6). A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) (valid for 30 days after the date of issue) is preferred; alternatively, a VCPR Form can also be used, or at a minimum, a signed attestation on the entry form, to fulfill the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Act.

2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases.

3. Official identification is required for all cattle. Official identification includes any of the following:

(a) A USDA issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag if applied prior to Nov. 5, 2024. This tag type is no longer valid for interstate movement if applied after Nov. 5, 2024.

(b) A 15-digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840" .

(c) Brands registered with a recognized brand inspection authority and accompanied by an official brand inspection certificate, when agreed to by the shipping and receiving State or Tribal animal health authorities; or

(d) Tattoos and other identification methods acceptable to a breed association for registration purposes, accompanied by a breed registration certificate, when agreed to by the shipping and receiving State or/Tribal animal health authorities.

(e) See Chapter B.2 for additional ID requirements specific to the Farm Show Complex.

4. Influenza A testing requirements (applicable only if there is a case of influenza A in dairy cattle in Pennsylvania):

(a). The dairy animals shall have been part of a biosecure assembled group for a period of at least 30 days prior to the date of sample collection in accordance with subsection (b). below. New animals may not have been added to the herd or group within the 30-day period preceding the date of sample collection, or after the date of sample collection and before movement.

(b). Individual dairy animals 18 months of age and older shall be tested within the seven days prior to entry into the exhibition.

i. Lactating dairy animals—A milk specimen shall be collected for testing in accordance with the provisions of this section from each lactating animal. Milk specimens shall be collected in a manner that is in accordance with National Veterinary Service Laboratory (NVSL) guidance to the testing National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) laboratory.

ii. Non-lactating dairy animals—Nasal swabs shall be collected for testing in accordance with the provisions of this section from each non-lactating animal. Nasal swabs shall be collected in a manner that is in accordance with NVSL guidance provided to the testing NAHLN laboratory.

(c). Milk specimens and nasal swabs shall be collected and submitted by or under the supervision of an accredited veterinarian (category II). The accredited veterinarian collecting or supervising the collection of the diagnostic specimens shall have a veterinarian-client-patient relationship (VCPR) with the owner or caretaker of the animal. Page 11 of 34

(d). Alternatively, "Monitored Status" for herds enrolled in the Pennsylvania Lactating Dairy Cow Health Monitoring Program removes the need for individual animal testing.

(e). Each specimen or sample collected and submitted under this section shall be tested for influenza A virus using polymerase chain reaction (PCR) testing and protocols approved by NVSL.

(f). Testing of all specimens or samples collected and submitted under this section shall be performed at a NAHLN laboratory. The individual specimens shall not be pooled by the accredited veterinarian (category II) or any person other than at the NAHLN laboratory testing the samples.

(g). All dairy cattle arriving at an animal exhibition shall have been tested in accordance with this section and shall have a negative or not-detected test result. The laboratory test report, or a copy of the report, shall accompany each dairy cow to the animal exhibition and shall be made available to the holder or staff of the animal exhibition and any Department employee. Animals enrolled and in compliance with the Pennsylvania Lactating Dairy Cow Health Monitoring Program shall be accompanied by proof of program enrollment and compliance as provided by the Department.

(h). Exemptions: Dairy cattle less than 18 months of age are not required to be tested for influenza A virus prior to exhibition.

5. See rabies vaccination requirements in the General section for animals exhibiting at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex

II. Recommendations:

1. While tattoos and brands are acceptable, 840 RFID tags are preferred.

2. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian for animals 3 months of age and older.

3. Rodeo: It is recommended that Pennsylvania-origin rodeo cattle of all ages be negative on an official tuberculin test within 60 days prior to the start of the fair unless they are members of and originate from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd. The cattle can be accompanied by the negative test report, or the tuberculosis test results can be recorded by the veterinarian on a CVI.

Out of State Cattle

I. Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation.

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) statement: See Chapter A.5

3. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.

4. Federal regulation (USDA) requires individual official animal identification for all cattle of any age for exhibition. This includes any of the following: Page 12 of 34

(a) A USDA issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag if applied prior to Nov. 5, 2024. This tag type is no longer valid for interstate movement if applied after Nov. 5, 2024.

(b) A 15-digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ISO-compliant RFID ear tag starting with "840" and bearing the US shield $\,$

(c) Brands registered with a recognized brand inspection authority and accompanied by an official brand inspection certificate, when agreed to by the shipping and receiving State or Tribal animal health authorities; or

(d) Tattoos and other identification methods acceptable to a breed association for registration purposes, accompanied by a breed registration certificate, when agreed to by the shipping and receiving State or/Tribal animal health authorities.

5. Tuberculosis testing requirements:

(a) No test is required for animals originating from states or zones designated as accredited free by the USDA.

(b) All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited advanced by the USDA must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and dates of tests must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).

(c) All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited by the USDA must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older are test negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation and the individual animals (all ages) to be imported are also test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test was completed. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable). (d) No cattle shall be imported into this Commonwealth if it has been exposed to tuberculosis test-positive animals or animals that have clinical signs consistent with tuberculosis.

(e) Special Tuberculosis Test requirement for Rodeo Cattle. All rodeo cattle and bison from out of state shall be negative on an official tuberculosis test within 60 days prior to entering Pennsylvania unless they originate from and are members of an Accredited Tuberculosis-free herd within an accredited Tuberculosis-free state or zone. This requirement for rodeo cattle from out-of-state is in addition to all other requirements listed above for out-of-state cattle.

6. Influenza A Testing requirements:

(a). The dairy animals shall have been part of a biosecure assembled group for a period of at least 30 days prior to the date of sample collection in accordance with subsection (b). below. New animals may not have been added to the herd or group within the 30-day period preceding the date of sample collection, or after the date of sample collection and before movement.

(b). Individual dairy animals 18 months of age and older shall be tested within the seven days prior to entry into the exhibition.

i. Lactating dairy animals—A milk specimen shall be collected for testing in accordance with the provisions of this section from each lactating animal. Milk specimens shall be collected in a manner that is in accordance with National Veterinary Service Laboratory (NVSL) guidance to the testing National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) laboratory. Page 13 of 34

ii. Non-lactating dairy animals—Nasal swabs shall be collected for testing in accordance with the provisions of this section from each non-lactating animal. Nasal swabs shall be collected in a manner that is in accordance with NVSL guidance provided to the testing NAHLN laboratory.

(c). Milk specimens and nasal swabs shall be collected and submitted by or under the supervision of an accredited veterinarian (category II). The accredited veterinarian collecting or supervising the collection of the diagnostic specimens shall have a veterinarian-client-patient relationship (VCPR) with the owner or caretaker of the animal.
(d). Alternatively, "Monitored Status" for herds enrolled in a federally compliant influenza A dairy herd bulk tank testing program removes the need for individual animal testing.

(e). Each specimen or sample collected and submitted under this section shall be tested for influenza A virus using polymerase chain reaction (PCR) testing and protocols approved by NVSL.

(f). Testing of all specimens or samples collected and submitted under this section shall be performed at a NAHLN laboratory. The individual specimens shall not be pooled by the accredited veterinarian (category II) or any person other than at the NAHLN laboratory testing the samples.

(g). All dairy cattle arriving at an animal exhibition shall have been tested in accordance with this section and shall have a negative or not-detected test result. The laboratory test report, or a copy of the report, shall accompany each dairy cow to the animal exhibition and shall be made available to the holder or staff of the animal exhibition and any Department employee. Animals enrolled and in compliance with an influenza A dairy herd bulk tank surveillance program in the state of origin and approved by USDA APHIS or the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture shall be accompanied by proof of program enrollment and compliance.

(h). Exemptions: Dairy cattle less than 18 months of age are not required to be tested for influenza A virus prior to exhibition.

7. Rabies vaccination requirements: See rabies vaccination requirements in the General section for animals exhibiting at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex.

II. Recommendations:

1. While tattoos and brands are acceptable, $840\ \mathrm{RFID}$ tags are preferred.

2. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

Section 6: Goats and Sheep - General Information

1. For post-exhibition sales the following requirements apply:

(a) Market sheep and goats must be documented on sales slips which contain all of the following information:

(i) Official identification (as described above)

(ii) Sale date

(iii) Sale location

(iv) Name, address, and phone number of the exhibitor

(v) Hauler contact information

(vi) Destination name and contact information

(vii) Total number of animals in the shipment

(viii) Type of sheep or goat (i.e., meat, dairy, specific breed) (ix) For sheep, face color (x) Signature of consignee, agent, or hauler (b) Sales slips, or a document containing all of the information required under subsection (a) above, must follow the sheep or goats to their final destination (including slaughter facilities).

(c) Sheep or goats which are purchased with the intent of breeding and are traveling via interstate movement must have a valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) prior to movement to the destination state.

(d) A copy of the sale records slips as delineated above and a copy of any CVI, required under subsection (c) above, must be kept by the sale organizer for 5 years.

Pennsylvania Goats and Sheep

I. Requirements:

1. Pennsylvania sheep and goats must have verification of a veterinary-client-patient relationship (see Chapter A.6). A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) (valid for 30 days after the date of issue) is preferred; alternatively, a VCPR Form can also be used, or at a minimum, a signed attestation on the entry form, to fulfill the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Act.

2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases.

3. Individual official animal identification is required for all sheep and goats. Identification used for sheep and goats must be permanently affixed to the individual animal. Official ID includes any of the following:

(a) A USDA ear tag with a US shield ; which includes scrapie program tags (animals bearing identification with blue colored scrapie program tags labelled "meat" with a US shield are not permitted to be exhibited in Pennsylvania). Please call the Department at 717-772-2852 if such a tag is encountered). (b) A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database (Scrapie tattoo – flock ID in the right ear, state postal code and letters/ numbers and individual animal ID in the left ear).

(c) A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.

(d) See Chapter B.2 for additional ID requirements specific to the Farm Show Complex

4. See rabies vaccination requirements for exhibition of sheep at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex in the general section.

II. Recommendations:

1. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for sheep 3 months of age and older

2. Extra-label use of the rabies vaccine in goats should be discussed with the exhibitor's veterinarian.

Out of State Goats and Sheep

I. Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation into Pennsylvania.

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) statement: See Chapter A.5

3. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI

4. Individual official animal identification is required for all sheep and goats. Identification used for sheep and goats must be permanently affixed to the individual animal. Official ID includes any of the following:

(a) A USDA ear tag with a US shield ; which includes scrapie program tags (animals bearing identification with blue colored scrapie program tags labelled "meat" with a US shield are not permitted to be exhibited in Pennsylvania. Please call the Department at 717-772-2852 if such a tag is encountered).
(b) A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database (Scrapie tattoo – flock ID in the right ear, state postal code and letters/ numbers and individual animal ID in the left ear).

(c) A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.

(d) See Chapter B.2 for additional ID requirements specific to the Farm Show Complex

5. Tuberculosis testing requirements (Goats only):

(a) No test is required for animals originating from states or zones designated as accredited-free by the USDA.

(b) All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited advanced by the USDA must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).

(c) All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older have tested negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual animals (all ages) to be imported have also tested negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test was completed. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).

(d) No goat shall be imported into this Commonwealth if it has been exposed to tuberculosis test-positive animals or animals that have clinical signs consistent with tuberculosis.

6. See rabies vaccination requirements for exhibition of sheep at the Farm Show Complex in the general section.

II. Recommendations:

1. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for sheep 3 months of age and older 2. Extra-label use of the rabies vaccine in goats should be discussed with the exhibitor's veterinarian.

Section 8: Rabbits

Pennsylvania Rabbits

I. Requirements:

1. Pennsylvania rabbits must have verification of a veterinaryclient-patient relationship (see Chapter A.6). A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) (valid for 30 days after the date of issue) is preferred; alternatively, a VCPR Form can also be used, or at a minimum, a signed attestation on the entry form, to fulfill the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Act.

2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases

3. While on exhibit or at any time following exhibition, exhibitors and exhibition managers are obligated to report all mass mortality events and all rabbits who show signs of a dangerous transmissible disease to the Department's emergency line at 717-772-2852, option 1. Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease is of particular concern, and clinical signs include bleeding from eyes, nose, mouth, or have bloody stools.

II. Recommendations:

1. Vaccination against RHDV-2: Vaccination of Pennsylvania origin rabbits against RHDV-2 is encouraged.

Out of State Rabbits

I. Requirements:

1. Rabbits originating from a Commonwealth, State, Territory or Country identified as being affected by RHD within the 12 months prior to the start of the exhibition: No rabbits or their products, such as meat, pelts, hides, carcasses or other items, and no equipment, exposed feed, forages, or conveyances or other items or associated materials may enter the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from a Commonwealth, State, Territory, or Country where RHD has been diagnosed in the prior twelve (12) months or there is a reasonable suspicion it exists unless they meet the following requirements:

(a) All live rabbits must be accompanied by a CVI and must be examined by an accredited veterinarian within the seventytwo (72) hours prior to the date of shipment to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The CVI must include statements by an accredited veterinarian certifying that:

(i) All rabbits in the shipment have been examined for and found free of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases;

(ii) All rabbits have originated from a single premises that has no signs of infectious, contagious or communicable disease in rabbits; (iii) There have been no movements of rabbits onto the premises of origin within the 90 days prior to the date of shipment; and

(iv) The rabbits have had no contact with wild or captive rabbits other than their cohorts in the 90 days prior to the date of shipment.

(b) No rabbits or their products, such as meat, pelts, hides, carcasses or other items, and no equipment, exposed feed or conveyances or other items or associated materials may enter the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from a premises exposed to, contaminated with or known to be affected with RHD, or where there is a reasonable suspicion the disease exists or the rabbits have been exposed to or infected with RHD.

(c) Current information on affected states can be found on the USDA's website: <u>www.aphis.usda.gov/livestock-poultry-</u> <u>disease/rabbit-hemorrhagic</u>

II. Recommendations:

1. For all rabbits: Vaccination against RHDV-2 is encouraged. PLEASE NOTE: Vaccination of rabbits does not exempt the rabbit, rabbit products, or equipment used for them, from meeting the import requirements set forth in the Department's "Interstate/International Quarantine Order; Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease [50 Pa.B. 5272, Saturday, September 26, 2020] and listed in above.

2. For rabbits that originate from a Commonwealth, State, Territory, or Country where RHD has NOT been diagnosed in the prior twelve (12) months or there is NO reasonable suspicion it exists: A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) (valid for 30 days after the date of issue) should be issued and shall include statements by an accredited veterinarian certifying that:

"All rabbits in the shipment have been examined for and found free of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases including RHD and there have not been multiple mortality events or rabbits exhibiting hemorrhages within the last 90 days. The rabbits in this shipment have not been housed or exhibited with any rabbits associated with known mass mortality or hemorrhage events."

"In the last 90 days, the rabbits in this shipment, have not been exhibited in, housed in, or traveled to, any state or territory in which RHD has been diagnosed within the last 12 months. In addition, during the last 90 days, they have had no contact with any captive or wild rabbit originating from or travelled to one of those affected states or territories."

Section 9: Swine

General Information

1. Immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition, all swine must be visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee. 2. All swine at an exhibition must be inspected daily by a certified swine health monitor appointed by the fair or show/event organizers.

(i) Swine health monitors must complete annual online training found at extension.psu.edu/Pennsylvania-show-and-fair-swine-health-monitor-training.

(ii) Swine health monitors must provide a current completion certificate to the fair or show staff they will be performing monitoring services for prior to the start of the event. 3. All breeding swine exhibitions must occur prior to the arrival of any market swine. All the following conditions apply: (a) Castrated swine shall not be classified as breeding swine.

(b) Breeding swine shall be removed from the animal exhibition premises prior to any market swine arriving.

(c) Breeding swine for exhibitions shall arrive, exhibit, and depart in a period no greater than 72 hours. Time begins when the first swine arrives physically on the fairgrounds whether unloaded from a trailer or not and ends when the last hog physically leaves the premises on a trailer.

(d) Swine birthing exhibitions and educational displays in which swine are not competing may occur concurrently with market swine animal exhibition, as long as reasonable precaution is made to ensure the biosecurity of the swine birthing exhibition or educational display. Consult your Department regional veterinarian or your herd veterinarian for biosecurity advice.

4. All market swine exhibited in Department sponsored or funded market shows shall move as allin and all-out directly to a Department or USDA licensed slaughter facility following the animal exhibition and may not be diverted to premises other than a recognized slaughter establishment or a slaughter market in which the sales are designated slaughter-only sales. Shows should keep records of all sales for a minimum of 2 years and provide these upon request to the Department.

5. Shows that are not sponsored by or that do not receive funding from the Department, including jackpot shows and 4-H roundups, not occurring during a Department sponsored or funded fair or show are exempt from the terminal slaughter requirement only if the following conditions are adhered to:

(a) The swine shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the 30 days prior to the date of the exhibition and shall be permanently identified by an 840 series RFID identification ear tag.

(b) Arrival, exhibition and departure of the swine shall occur within a 72-hour window. Time begins when the first swine arrives physically on the exhibition grounds, whether unloaded from a trailer or not, and ends when the last hog physically leaves the premises on a trailer.

(c) There shall be no public access to the animals other than observation during competitions.

(d) An accredited veterinarian or trained swine health monitor shall have visually inspected the animals prior to unloading and found each animal to be free of signs of contagious disease. (e) An accredited veterinarian or trained swine health monitor shall monitor and record the health of the pigs daily for signs of contagious disease, and the accredited veterinarian shall immediately report suspicion of disease to the State Animal Health Official.

(f) A Veterinary-client-patient-relationship is established between the show committee/management staff and an accredited veterinarian, and that veterinarian is readily available for health monitoring, emergency coverage, treatment, follow up evaluation, and prompt reporting of suspicion of disease to the State Animal Health Official.

6. A conveyance used for the transportation of swine to animal exhibitions, fairs and shows shall be cleaned and disinfected by an exhibitor prior to each use and shall be free of visible accumulations of manure, bedding and other organic materials. 7. At the conclusion of swine animal exhibitions, fairs and shows and after all swine have left the premises, the fair board or livestock show committee shall ensure all holding pens and animal exhibition areas have had all bedding and other organic material removed and all areas, including fences, gates, stalls, holding pens, containers, housing, coming in contact with or through which swine were moved shall be put through the fair board or livestock show committee's cleaning and disinfection process.

Pennsylvania Swine:

I. Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of the exhibition.

2. Official identification is required for all swine and must be an official 840 series RFID ear tag. This number must appear on the CVI.

II. Recommendations:

1. Extra-label use of the rabies vaccine in this species should be discussed with the exhibitor's veterinarian.

Out of State Swine Requirements: 1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of the exhibition is required. The CVI shall include a statement verifying that the swine have not been fed raw garbage. 2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) Statement: See Chapter A.5 3. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI. 4. Official identification is required for all swine and must be an official 840 series RFID ear tag. This number must appear on the CVI. 5. Brucellosis Testing Requirements: No Brucellosis test is required if the animal originates from a validated brucellosis-free herd within a Brucellosis free state. All others must be tested negative within the 30 days prior to the date of importation. The date of test and test results must be included on the CVI. 6. Pseudorabies Testing Requirements: No Pseudorabies test is required if the animal originates from a Qualified Pseudorabiesfree herd within a Pseudorabies free state. All others must be tested negative within the 30 days prior to the date of importation. The date of test and test results must be included on the CVI. II. Recommendations: 1. Extra-label use of the rabies vaccine in this species should be discussed with the exhibitor's veterinarian

THIS RULE MUST BE COMPLIED WITH. THE FAIR **RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ACCEPT OR REJECT AN ENTRY** OR TO REMOVE FROM THE GROUNDS ANY **OBJECTIONABLE EXHIBIT OR ATTENDANT WITHOUT** BEING LIABLE FOR COMPENSATION.

1. When filling out entry blanks, specify class for each specimen; state breed, color and marking, sex and whether old or young from this year. Enter in order of old male, old female, young male, young female for each variety. Exhibitor tickets are to be ordered and paid for at the time entry blanks are submitted (six exhibitor tickets for \$6.00).

2. Due to limited cooping facilities, the entry clerk reserves the right

to limit the number of exhibits entered by each exhibitor. The entry clerk reserves the right to make alterations which seem necessary for the success of the exhibition. Furthermore, the management reserves the right of refusing any entries which are not deemed desirable for the best interest of the show or those not entered on an Allentown Fair Entry Blank. All rules apply to Open and Youth exhibitors.

3. Entry fees - \$1.00 for single Pigeon, Bantam and Standard Poultry. No entry fees for 4-H/Ag-Ed. Entry fees are payable when entries are made. Make check payable to Allentown Fair. Entry specimens must be the bon fide property of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the opening day of the Fair. Entry Limit is 50 pigeons per immediate family; entry limit is 50 poultry per immediate family.

4. ENTRIES MUST BE MADE ON OFFICIAL ENTRY BLANKS LOCATED IN THE BACK OF THIS BOOK. COPIES CAN BE MADE OF THESE ENTRY PAGES. ENTRIES MUST BE MADE ENTERED IN SEQUENCE AS IN THE PREMIUM LIST. YOU MUST SPECIFY CORRECT CLASS NUMBER. IF THERE ARE ERRORS ON THE ENTRY THE SECRETARY SHALL RETURN THOSE ENTRIES FOR CORRECTION AND THEY MUST BE RETURNED BEFORE THE CLOSING DAY AND ARE CONSIDERED FOR ENTRY UPON FINAL RECEIPT. 5. Health certificates of pullorum eradication, which must be completed and accompany the fowl entries, can be obtained from the PA Dept. of Ag. Bureau of Animal Health and Diagnostic Services, Rm 410 Agricultural Bldg., 2301 N. Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9408 Phone 717-783-8555.

6. No changes or substitutions will be permitted after acceptance of any entry except in same breed, class, color and sex.

7. Exhibits will be received/cooped on Saturday, August 24, from 9AM - 3PM. It is required for each exhibitor to coop in and remove his or her own exhibits. Exhibits MUST be removed on Monday, Labor Day [Sept. 2], from 5PM - 6PM. No exhibits are to be removed at any other time. Violation of this rule automatically voids all premium money due violator.

8. Exhibitors will receive lists with coop numbers for each individual specimen, to be placed in the coop with the specified number thereon. 9. No specimen is to be handled by anyone except the owner, the judges, or members of the show management, unless permission is granted by the owner.

10. Young specimens shall not be considered eligible for competition unless they have reached two-thirds mature development.

11. No exhibit shall bre marked in any way by the exhibitor except with an official PDA leg band [note: pigeons do not require official PDA leg band; however, they must bear a unique individual identification leg band].

12. Distinctive names or markings shall not be placed on the display coops prior to judging. After the awards are made, advertising material suitable to the management may be placed on the cages. 13. Judging will begin at 9AM on Sunday, August 25.

14. After exhibits have been judged, the changing of the original exhibit is forbidden. Violation of this RULE will result in forfeit of all awards and premiums plus refusal of entries for two years.

15. Only one bird is necessary to fill a class.

1. Rabbits will be screened on arrival for health and show conditions. No rabbits showing signs of contagious or infectious disease will be admitted to the show.

2. Department superintendents have the final judgment in resolving any dispute. Due to limited cooping facilities, the entry clerk reserves the right to limit the number of entries per exhibitor. The entry clerk reserves the right to make alterations which seem necessary for the success of the exhibition. Furthermore, the management reserves the right of refusing entries which are not deemed desirable for the best interest of the show or those not entered on an Allentown Fair Entry Blank. All rules apply to Open and Youth exhibitors.

3. Rabbits and Cavies will be received Saturday, August 23, from 9AM cooped by 3PM and Sunday, August 24, from 7AM and cooped by 8AM.

4. It is required for each exhibitor to coop in and remove his or her own exhibits. Exhibits are removed from 5 - 6PM Monday, Labor Day, September 1, 2025. All exhibits MUST BE REMOVED from the barn by 6PM. Violation of this rule automatically voids all premium money due violator.

5. Judging will take place Sunday, August 24, from 9AM until all exhibits have been judged. The Allentown Fair Association reserves the right to substitute or hire additional judges.

6. All entries must be made on official entry blanks located in the back of this book. Copies can be made of these entry blanks. Only one exhibitor per entry blank. Separate entry blanks are necessary for OPEN and 4-H/AG-ED entries.

7. Entries must be made entered in sequence as in the premium list. You must specify correct class number. If there are errors on the entry the secretary shall return those entries for correction and they must be returned before the closing day and are considered for entry upon final receipt.

8. Pennsylvania exhibitors will have preference for cooping. Entered specimens must be the bon fide property of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the opening day of the Fair. Entry Limit is 50 rabbits per immediate family; entry limit is 50 cavies per immediate family.

9. <u>ENTRY FEES</u> - Rabbits and Cavies \$1.00 each. Make checks payable to Allentown Fair. Entry fees must accompany entry form/online entries.

10. There are no entry fees for 4-H/Ag-Ed Entries. Entries open upon receipt of Premium List and close as noted on pg 2, unless cooping capacity is reached before this date. Classes are for Bucks and Does according to the A.R.B.A. show rules. Must have signature of leader as proof of being a member of group.

SHOW RULES

Youth may show same animal in OPEN and 4-H/AG-ED. Youth must be a bona fide member of a 4-H group or registered in AG-ED.

All stock must be permanently earmarked for your protection. The greatest possible care will be given to all exhibits, but the Allentown Fair will not be responsible for any accidents, mistakes, theft, fire loss or damage that occurs. Competent employees will be in attendance.

The Fair reserves the right to accept or reject entirely, partially or conditionally any entry or application. The management also reserves the right to personally, or to appoint a committee, to inspect all entries after they have arrived, and dismiss any entries that would discredit the Fair.

During judging hours, no one except officials of the show and their officially designated helpers will be allowed to handle or groom any stock.

RULES FOR LEHIGH COUNTY 4-H LIVESTOCK ROUND-UP SHOW AND SALE OF MARKET ANIMALS

1. All Round-Up steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs, and goats, must be individually entered in the Allentown Fair by the deadline on the official entry form. A 4-H Club Leader or Extension Educator must sign all entry forms. All participants must be standing members of Lehigh County 4-H Livestock Club.

2. All Round-Up steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs and goats

must have a legible numbered ear tag or tattoo in their ear.

3. Exhibitors may show and sell one steer, up to three hogs, up to two lambs, up to two dairy beef, and up to two goats.

All eligible steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs and goats entered which meet required weight limits must be sold unless the Sale Committee has been otherwise notified.

4. All steers, lambs, and goats must arrive on the Fairgrounds by 5:30PM on Tuesday of fair week. Animals can be brought in earlier, but no animals should be unloaded before the Livestock Office personnel check them for proper health papers. The exhibitor is responsible for the care of the animals during their stay at the Allentown Fair.

5. Weighing of steers, lambs, and goats will be from 3:30PM to 7:00PM on Tuesday of fair week. Market hogs will weigh in on Thursday of fair week at 9:00AM. Steers must weigh at least 900 pounds. Hogs must weigh at least 225 pounds and not over 295 pounds; the hog weight limits are subject to change. Please contact your 4-H leader of the Extension Office one month in advance for additional information. No weight limits for lambs. Blanketed lambs and goats will be reduced by one pound. Goats must weigh between 50-120 pounds. Exhibitor must be present, or arrange for someone to take his or her animal to the scale during the designated time period. Animals not meeting weight requirements will not be eligible for Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion. Animals not meeting weight requirements will NOT be allowed to sell. however these animals may be exhibited in showmanship classes. 6. Steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs and goats will be shown in the weight classes and at the time listed on pg 2 - Youth Exhibits of the

Allentown Fair Premium List.

7. Judging for Showmanship contest will follow the same schedule that is listed on pg 2 - Youth Exhibits of the Allentown Fair Premium List.

8. All steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs and goats must be shown and presented at the sale by their owners except if the member is ill, away at school, or absent for other reasons. Each absence must be approved in advance by the Round-Up committee. The animal may then be shown or presented for sale by another 4-H member as an alternate. An alternate Showman or Fitter is not eligible for awards. 9. Set-up for the sale area will begin Friday evening and resume at approximately 8AM on Saturday of fair week. Round-Up participants shall assist in the set-up and bring their animals to the sale area.

10. The sale will begin at 1:00PM on Saturday of fair week in the Livestock Tent. The sale order will be announced.

11. Sale order for each species shall be as follows: Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, the remaining first place class winners and so on. A Banner will be awarded to the buyer of each Grand Champion specie, and a Rosette to the buyer of each Reserve Grand Champion specie.

12. A suitable rope halter must be left on each steer after the sale.

13. Current Pennsylvania Health Rules and Regulations for steers, dairy beef, hogs, lambs, and goats apply. See Health Regulations listed in Allentown Fair Premium List.

14. Animals will be sold by the head.

15. Animals must not have received any drugs, biologicals, chemicals, etc. within the prescribed withdrawal period, or used for a purpose other than that the product is labeled for. All participants must have completed the appropriate 4-H quality assurance program. All requirements of the 4-H project must be completed to participate in the sale.



18. Under the "buy back program," a buyer who wants to support the 4-H program without receiving an animal, may sell the animal back to the sponsor of the "buy back program" at the current market price (announced prior to the sale). The buyer would then only pay the difference between the sale price and the current market price.

They may register for the "buy back program" just before the sale begins.
